## PROP. 76'S POTENTIAL IMPACT ON STATE BUDGET

### Teleconference October 11 for Reporters, Editors, and Columnists

SACRAMENTO--Proposition 76, arguably the most complex initiative in the November special election, will dramatically change the rules governing the state's budget process.

On Tuesday, October 11, the California Budget Project invites political reporters, editorial writers, editors, and columnists to a teleconference analyzing:

- How will Proposition 76 impact state spending?
- Will Proposition 76 give California's governor more power than governors have in other states?
- How will Proposition 76 affect school, social services, and Medi-Cal spending?
- How will Proposition 76 affect Proposition 10's tobacco tax for early childhood education?
