## THE GOVERNOR'S REVISED BUDGET WOULD CUT IHSS SERVICES FOR 84,000 LOW-INCOME SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES ACROSS CALIFORNIA

The In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Program provides services to low-income seniors and people with disabilities who live in their own homes to help prevent more costly out-of-home care. In January, Governor Schwarzenegger proposed to reduce hours of domestic services — including meal preparation, laundry, and errands — provided to IHSS recipients by 17.8 percent in 2008-09. The Governor's May Revision withdraws that proposal and instead proposes to eliminate domestic services for IHSS recipients with less severe impairments beginning on October 1, 2008. This change would reduce IHSS Program funding by \$159.5 million and affect approximately 84,000 vulnerable Californians.
