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## THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSED BUDGET WOULD MAKE DEEP CUTS IN FUNDING FOR CALIFORNIA'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS

California's public schools serve 6.3 million students in 1,043 school districts. The Governor's Proposed 2010-11 Budget proposes to reduce funding for K-12 education by \$2.7 billion — a reduction equivalent to \$432 per student. This analysis examines the impact of \$1.8 billion (67.1 percent) of the proposed cuts at the county level. The analysis includes the Governor's proposed reductions to K-12 school district and county office of education (COE) apportionments, which provide general operating support for local schools and COEs, and to cost-of-living adjustments for K-12 school districts. The analysis *excludes* the Governor's proposal to reduce funding for the K-3 Class Size Reduction Program by \$890 million since data are not yet available to assess the impact of this reduction at the county level.
