

Percentage of People Ages 18 to 64 Who Speak English Less Than "Very Well," 2008-2012

The share of Californians ages 18 to 64 who speak English less than "very well" was **21.7 percent** in the years 2008 through 2012. This statewide share obscures significant differences across California counties. Trinity County had the lowest share (1.0 percent), while Imperial County had the highest (33.8 percent).
