

## The CalWORKs Grant Is Lower Than Cash Assistance for Families in 22 States, When Compared to Housing Costs

- of housing is often a barrier for families struggling to make ends meet. A single mother with two kids would need to work 2.9 full-time, minimum-wage jobs to afford a two-bedroom apartment at the estimated statewide Fair Market Rent (FMR).
- cash assistance for families to help with costly budget items like rent, while also helping parents find and keep jobs. Yet in 2014, a mother with two kids could only cover half of the FMR with the entire maximum monthly CalWORKs grant. After factoring in the cost of housing, the CalWORKs grant is lower than cash assistance in 22 other states.
- Policymakers could help CalWORKs families attain stable housing, a key component of economic security, by increasing CalWORKs grants and boosting investment in the CalWORKs Housing Support Program.
