
NAPOLITANO: THE UC CONTEXT

- Declining state appropriations
- Increased enrollment demand
- Demand for more diverse student body
- Maintain world class research



PRESERVE ACCESS AND QUALITY

GOVERNOR BROWN: STATE CONTEXT



- State fiscal prudence
- Ensure postsecondary fiscal discipline
- Maintain affordability
- Ensure broad access
- Ensure outcomes and accountability

PRESERVE ACCESS AND AFFORDABILITY

THREE YEAR DEGREES

- Improves affordability
- Improves time to degree
- Maintains access
- Reduces per student institutional costs
- Between 2000-4000 undergrad spaces created

- Which disciplines most suited to 3 year degrees?
- How many graduates in those disciplines?
- What is cost savings?
- What is opportunity cost?

COURSE EQUIVALENCIES

- Expedites and increases transfer
- Creates consistent lower division requirements
- Includes credit for APs and IB programs

- Which disciplines/courses most likely for equivalencies?
- How many students would be impacted?
- Could UC accommodate increased transfer?
- How much would UC save by offering fewer lower division courses?

ONLINE COURSES

- Streamlines course delivery
- Improves multi-campus course delivery
- Cost savings through online textbooks
- Shifts how students obtain their education
- Broader course offerings
- Reduces time to degree

- Is academic quality equivalent?
- Are completion results equitable?

REWARDING WORK EXPERIENCE

- Promotes degree completion
- Especially effective with certain sub-populations

- To whom would this apply?
- Can policies be comprehensive and consistent across institutions?

DISCIPLINARY CONSOLIDATION

- Increases efficiency by reducing duplication of courses and programs
- Specialization increases the profile/reputation of the institutions
- Leverages regional and sectoral strengths

- Budget implications?
- Resource tradeoffs?
- Longer term expenses?
- Opportunity costs?
- Faculty support?
