# Top priorities for kids in Medi-Cal

- 1. Increased opportunities to analyze & address children's unique needs
- 2. Home visiting
- 3. Developmental & behavioral screenings
- 4. Vaccinations
- 5. Coverage for former foster youth
- 6. Implementing behavioral health treatment for children with autism spectrum disorders

### Over half of California's kids are enrolled in Medi-Cal



As of July 2012 nearly 4.5 million children under 18 were enrolled in Medi-Cal and Healthy Families. During 2013, all children in the separate Healthy Families Program were transferred into the consolidated Medi-Cal program<sup>1</sup>.

Almost 560,000 children (ages 0-18) were enrolled in Medi-Cal during the Covered California open enrollment period between October 1, 2013 and March 31, 2014. This is 29%<sup>2</sup> of the total number enrolled in Medi-Cal via the California Healthcare Eligibility, Enrollment, and. Retention System.<sup>3</sup>

Adding these two numbers together, we estimate there are at least 5 million children enrolled in Medi-Cal as of mid-2014.

There were approximately 9.16 million children under 18 in California in 2013, or 23.9% of the total 38,332,521 Californians.<sup>4</sup>

# Opportunities to analyze & address kids' needs

- + Medi-Cal Children's Health Advisory Panel
- + DATA! Need more child-specific data, for example a pediatric version of the Medi-Cal managed care dashboard
- + Transfer between Medi-Cal & Covered California
- + Unique access and reimbursement rate impacts



# Voluntary home visiting

Only a small number of California's young children have received home visits



have 1 or more risk factors and would likely benefit from home visiting

have received 1 or more home visits



Based on 1.4 million children age 0 - 3 in California Risk factors include poverty, health, school, and developmental problems

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### **Developmental & behavioral screenings**

- Pediatricians recommend that infants and toddlers receive a developmental & behavioral screening at least 3 times before a child's 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday (Bright Futures guidelines)
- + Developmental & behavioral screenings are a proven way to identify children in need and connect them with early intervention services
- + Only 29% of California's infants/toddlers receive recommended screenings, including only 10% of Black, non-Hispanic infants/toddlers (2011-12)
- + Need Medi-Cal-specific data on developmental & behavioral screenings
- + Need better linkages between the health care system and early intervention, education, child care, child welfare, social services sectors at the local level



### Vaccinations

- Recent California-based outbreaks of whooping cough and measles have heightened the public health risks of infectious disease and the consequences of lowered herd immunity – an issue complicated by personal belief exemptions
- + Medi-Cal and the Child Health and Disability Prevention (CHDP) Program are key sites and sources of vaccination delivery
- + DHCS identified improvements in 2-year-old immunization rates as a priority in their draft 2014 Quality Strategy report, based on HEDIS scores.
- + Supports and incentives will need to be aligned for providers and plans throughout the layers of contracting to improve and sustain immunization rates in practices

# Enrolling former foster youth in Medi-Cal

- + Covered til 26 outreach campaign to enroll former foster youth in Medi-Cal
- + Former foster youth must enroll at county offices because CalHEERS does not yet correctly assign them to Medi-Cal



# Implementing behavioral health treatment coverage for children in Medi-Cal

- + Behavioral Health Treatment for children with autism spectrum disorder added as a covered benefit; State Plan Amendment submitted September 30, 2014
- + Major outstanding questions
  - + Will rates be sufficient?
  - + Will Comprehensive Diagnostic Evaluation (CDE) will be required before any services are covered, even for kids younger than 3 years?
