


California Women's Well-Being Index

Earnings Fact Sheet

The California Women's Well-Being Index provides a comprehensive, composite measure of how women are faring in each of the state's 58 counties. The Index encompasses five "dimensions" – Health, Personal Safety, Employment & Earnings, Economic Security, and Political Empowerment – each of which is made up of six indicators. This fact sheet shows statewide data by race and ethnicity for the Earnings Indicator, as well as the value and rank for all 58 counties.

Note: Data are for individuals age 16 and over. Estimates reflect 2022 inflation-adjusted dollars. The ethnicity category ("Latinx") and the race categories are mutually exclusive.
