Providing Children with the Strong Foundation to Reach Their Full Potential



Children develop:


- Language, literacy and math skills
- Social/emotional and self-regulation skills needed to succeed
- Problem solving capacities


Preparing More Children for Kindergarten



- AIR finds children in TK have as much as a five- month learning advantage in literacy skills, math skills, and executive function when they start kindergarten
- Yet more than 30,000 lowincome 4 year olds and many more 3 year olds still do not have access to pre-k



The Stanford Center on Poverty and Inequality cites quality preschool as one of the most effective ways to reduce the achievement gap.





What does quality look like?

Building Blocks of Quality

- Comprehensive early learning standards and curricula
- 2. Appropriate child assessments
- 3. Professional knowledge and skill
- Ongoing support for teachers
- 5. Support for diverse learners

- 7. Sufficient time
- 8. Appropriate class size and teacher-student ratio
- 9. Comprehensive program assessments




Gov. Brown's 2016-17 Early Education Budget Proposal

Governor's Block Grant Proposal

Proposed Block Grant:

- Combines TK, State Preschool, quality improvement funding
- Concepts of Local Control Funding Formula
- Removes TK entitlement
- Quality standards not specified



Governor's Block Grant Proposal: Many Questions Remain

- If ADA funding is severed from TK, what happens to children entitled to public school education?
- What quality standards will apply?



- What becomes of the state's commitment to provide preschool for all low-income 4-year-olds?
- What about community-based preschool providers?
